**GENERAL ROBBLEE/ROBLEE REFERENCES**

**Carpenter, G. W. *Descendants of Ruben and Phebe Roblee. Revised April 1949 from Files of Mrs. Clarence Jones, Historian of Minerva, NY. Manuscript available through the Family History Library (Latter Day Saints), Call No. 929.273 A1 no. 6910.***

This nine-page manuscript, outlining the descendants of Ruben and Phebe Roblee of Granville, NY, appears to have several versions. This 1949 revision was supplemented by information provided by Mrs. William Wallace Roblee of Riverside, CA. Mrs. Roblee's information was almost certainly compiled by her father-in-law, Milo Resolvo Roblee (see next reference).

**Roblee, Milo Resolvo. *The Family Tree of the Roblees. Manuscript compiled by the author in 1900.***

Several different versions exist of this manuscript, compiled by M. R. Roblee based partially on visits with his North Creek, NY relatives. It was dictated to his son, William Wallace Roblee. Mr. Roblee asserts that the names was originally Roblyrd. He says "recently in an old French book of family names it was easily traced back to and beyond the 16<sup>th</sup> century".

Refers to Wm. Rubley of South Precinct and Elesor Baker of said precinct, who are found to be indebted to the King - in the amount of fines levied due to certain unspecified misdemeanors.

#1333 Between the King and Catherine Rubley, 1785

Refers to Catherine Rubley, spinster, of South Precinct, and Rubin Rubley, farmer, of South Precinct, who are found to be indebted to the King - in the amount of fines levied due to certain unspecified misdemeanors.

The first group of arrivals in Dutchess Co. was in the first quarter of the 18<sup>th</sup> century were largely of Dutch and Palentine German extraction, but included a few Wallons, French and English. The second, larger group were mostly English, from New England and Long Island, with a strong minority of Dutch from Long Island and New Jersey. From the first, Dutch and English languages competed for supremacy. Dutch began to give way to English in the 1760's. 18<sup>th</sup> century records are full of puzzling items produced by the phonetic spelling of Dutch words by English speaking people and vice versa.
