

**Some Descendants of Andrew Roblyer of Orange County, NY**  
**Compiled by Cindy Walcott <cwalcott141 at gmail dot com>**

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*It is important to note that this branch of the family is much less researched by me than the other branches. This report is offered in order to flesh out the possible descendants of the Rublears of Huntington, NY. We would love to hear from members of this family who may offer more information - and especially who would like to participate in our YDNA study. The project, called Roblee DNA Project, is housed at FTDNA. It is open to all family members. The more people who participate, the better. We hope that this project will help us to settle some longstanding questions about our family's origins.*

*Generation One*

1. **Andrew Rublier or Roblyer**, b. bef 11 Apr 1736 in Huntington, Suffolk Co., NY,<sup>1</sup> (son of **William Rublier** [1706 - 1770] and **Abigail Brush** [1708 -     ]), d. bet 1790-1800 in Warwick, Orange Co., NY (prob). Andrew Roblyer is tentatively the same Andrew Rublier who was baptized in Huntington in 1736. Whether he was the son of William or his brother Andrew is not known. We place him in William's family solely because he stayed in the United States during the American Revolution. This is a working theory -- and not necessarily fact.

The town of Warwick, NY was formed in April 1789. The Warwick Church was formed in 1764. By 1789, members included those with these surnames: Robblen, Robelaye, Roblyer.

In 1790, Andrew Rubilee was head of household in Warwick, Orange Co., NY. There were 9 household members: 2 males over 16, 2 under 16, and 5 females.

In 1800, Darcus Rubilee was head of household in Warwick, Orange Co., NY. There were 5 household members: 1 female over 45; 1 female 26-44; 1 female 16-25; 1 female 10-16 and 1 male 16-25.

In 1810, the following Roblees were heads of household in Warwick: Hiram, William, Darcas, and Isaac.

In 1820, Darcus Roblyer was head of household in Warwick. There were 3 household members: 2 females over 45 and 1 female 26-44.

The Roblyers apparently had a number of daughters.

Linda Sue Reasor's Worldconnect entry on Amos Hyatt of Warwick, NY mentions various land transactions in Warwick. Amos was a neighbor of various members of the Roblyer family.

2 Jun 1817 - reference to Darcus Rublee, Hiram Rublee

4 Sept 1819 - reference to Darcus Roblee and land formerly owned by Hiram Roblees

13 May 1833 - reference to Hiram Robelea

22 Feb 1840 - reference to Darcus Roblyea, Hiram Roblee. "Second Lot this lot was conveyed by Elizabeth Roblyea and Abigail Roblyea to Amos Hyatt by Deed beginning at a white oak bush.....lands formerly belonging to William Roblyea"

The following information was posted on the Tri-County Genealogy site by Joyce M. Tice. The information came from Thelma Roblier Welch.

"(These notes are from the family Bible that I have, as originally written in ink) Horace and Andrew Roblyer came from France, their native birthplace, during the Revolutionary War with General LaFayette, their Commander, and fought during the war under him from 1775 to 1784.

From these two sprang the Roblyer family in America. After the war they settled in New York City.

The spelling of the name has been in different ways, but the most common at present is spelled "Roblier". Those who reside in the Eastern states spell it "Roblyer" which is I presume is the proper way."

In 1800, William Rubilee lived in Warwick, Orange Co., NY with his family. They continued to live in Warwick in 1810. By 1820, it appears they had moved to Elmira, Chemung Co., NY. They remained there in 1830. In 1840, they lived in Dix, Chemung Co., NY. In 1850, Rachel lived with her son Townsend and family in Wayne, Steuben Co., NY.

4. **Hiram Lewis Roblyer**, b. 28 Mar 1779 in Orange Co., NY (prob),<sup>2</sup> d. 6 May 1857 in Rutland, Tioga Co., PA,<sup>2</sup> buried in Wood Cem., Sullivan, Tioga Co., PA.<sup>3</sup> Hiram Roblee lived in Warwick, Orange Co., NY in 1810.

The following information is summarized from information provided by Joyce Tice on her Tri-Counties Genealogy & History page.

Hiram was head of household in 1820 in Warwick, Orange Co., NY. They removed to Catlin, Chemung County, NY between 1822 and 1825. They were in Rutland Township in Tioga County, Pennsylvania in 1837. They located right on the boundary between Rutland and Sullivan. They continued to live in Rutland for the rest of their life.

In 1850, Hiram and Rhoda were 75 and 70. Their granddaughter, Harriet Tanner, age 14, was living with them, as was 10 year old Darius Knapp, who was the son of Amos and Elizabeth Knapp.

Hiram's will was probated 23 Jun 1858 in Rutland. Mentioned in his will were his sons Andrew J., David S. (a minor), Ira (deceased) and Hiram L. Roblyer. Also daughters Darkes M. Tanner; Sally, wife of N. Smith and Rhoda Roblyer (a minor- she may have been a granddaughter, not a daughter as it seems unlikely that Hiram and Rhoda would have a minor child that late) and granddaughter Louisa Smith (daughter of N. Smith's first wife). Son-in-law Northop Smith was administrator.

Depositions were filed by Amos Mansfield, Seth E. Howland, Samuel Wilson, John Wilson, James Wilson, David VanZile, M.C. Westbrook, Moses Crawford and George Crippen.

Hiram and Rhoda were described as natives of Orange County, New York, so they were likely both born there. They removed to Catlin, Chemung County, NY between 1822 and 1825 and then to Rutland, Tioga Co., PA. They were farmers. Inez Roblyer (Covell) has researched the descendants of Hiram and Rhoda in the 1980s.

Joyce Tice provides the following information about census enumerations. In the 1790 census index, the closest names are Robler, Robluer - all from Hanover Township, Morris County NJ. In 1800, she could not find any similar names. In 1810 she found Andrew, Benjamin, Ezra, James, and Stephen all in Seneca or Steuben Counties in NY. In 1820, Andrew and John W. and William were in Elmira which was then in Tioga County NY, now Chemung County; Dorcus and Hiram were in Warwick, Orange County NY, and John was in

Ulysses in Tompkins County NY. In 1830, Andrew, Beldin, and William were of Elmira, and John was in Big Flats, Hiram and family were in Catlin. In 1840, Andrew was in Athens, Calhoun County MI.

In 1850 a Lewis Riboler was a 25 year old laborer in the household of Henry P. VanNess on Rutland Hill, perhaps a nephew of Hiram and Rhoda.

Roblyer and family were living in Dix, Chemung Co., NY. In 1850, they were living in Painted Post, Steuben Co., NY. In 1860, they were living in Big Flats, Chemung Co., NY. John died there, according to US Mortality Schedules. Polly was living in Big Flats in 1870. In 1892, she contined to lived with daughter Sarah, now Sarah Miles.

Thursday, September 4, 1873 - Death Notice

Died in Barrington on the morning of the 21st inst., of cholera morbus, Mr. Lodowick Disbrow, aged eighty-four years. He was a native of Carmel, Putnam county, where he grew up to manhood. Soon after he came of age he left his early home without means and with his scanty wardrobe packed in an old style knapsack and slung upon his back, made his way to the lake country, then comparatively a wilderness, and brought up in Wayne, Steuben county, in what was afterwards called Barrington, where a few families from his native town had made a settlement, which was called for many years Sunderlin Hollow, near where the Crystal Spring now sends up its healing water. Here he worked for the settlers, his old neighbors, making his home with the late Mr. John Wright, paying for his board when not employed working for others. This was in 1812, and he became almost determined to leave the wilderness, and go back to the place of his birth, and with this idea in mind he went to the house of Mr. Daniel Sunderlin Sr., and told them his feelings on the subject. They spoke discouragingly, and finally he told one of the daughters if she would marry him, so he would have a home of his own, he would stay. After a little, she consented. The lady was Miss Elizabeth Sunderlin, who was two years his senior. They commenced on the farm now occupied by Mr. H.N. Townsend. He and his wife were the parents of six children, four sons and two daughters who grew up to maturity and married, one of each are now dead. The wife of his youth died in 1862. He [then] married Mrs. Stanton, widow of the late Mr. Julius Stanton, Sen., with whom and an adopted daughter of hers he spent the last few years of his life. Dundee Record

He has been a valuable and prosperous citizen, added much to his original purchase and made valuable improvements. His wife was Mary Roblyer (or Raplee as modernized), and they have a very worthy family of children. They are William, Alonzo, Augustus C, Emily, Olive, Addie and Annette. William married Mariette Mather, and resides near his father. Alonzo married Ann Eliza Peck, and also resides in the same vicinity. Augustus C. married Betty Paine. He and his wife are both teachers of celebrity and rare acquirements, and have since their marriage spent some time in Europe perfecting their studies. Emily Winters is also a superior teacher, now at Nyack, N. Y." (Source: History and Directory Yates County, Containing a Sketch of its original Settlement...)

After a search of about three hours, his body was found suspended in the barn as above stated. He leaves a wife and quite a numerous family who feel that they have lost a friend, husband, and affectionate parent. The deceased was a consistent member of the M. E. Church, and a faithful follower of the Saviour. He was a man in good circumstances supposed to be worth about ten thousand dollars. His age, sixty-three years.

Agitator May 5, 1859 - We noticed last week the suicide of Mr. Joshua Smith of Sullivan. Since then a friend has sent us the following particulars in regard to the melancholy occurrence. "An inquest held by Coroner Rose disclosed the fact that Mr. Smith had been laboring under a depression of spirits for some time past, caused by imaginary difficulties. He arose on Tuesday morning as usual, and after breakfast went out to assist his hired man about repairing some fence; his man left him at work at about ten

o'clock; he was not missed until about noon. Search was immediately instituted for him under a vague suspicion that all was not right, and his lifeless body was found about five o'clock in the afternoon, hanging in the barn near his residence. He leaves a wife and quite a numerous family who feel that they have lost a kind husband, and affectionate father. Mr. Smith was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in good standing. His estate is supposed to be worth about ten thousand dollars."

"HIRAM L. ROBLYER was born near Horseheads, Chemung county, New York, March 14, 1825, a son of Hiram and Rhoda (Sanford) Roblyer. His parents were natives of Orange County, New York, whence they removed to Chemung county, and in 1837 located in Rutland township, Tioga county, Pennsylvania, where they died, the father May 6, 1857, aged eighty-two, and the mother, November 27, 1859, aged seventy-eight. Their children were as follows: Austin, Diadama, Andrew J., David S. and Ira, all of whom are dead; Dorcas M., widow of A. B. Tanner; Hannah J., deceased; Sally Ann, widow of Northrop Smith, of Sullivan township, and Hiram L. The subject of this sketch came to Tioga county with his parents when twelve years old, and was reared to manhood in Rutland township. He afterwards worked as a farm hand for several years. In 1851 he embarked in merchandising at Elk Run in partnership with Northrop Smith, but in 1857 he sold his interest to Mr. Smith and bought his present farm of 104 acres, on which he has since lived. Mr. Roblyer was married October 3, 1855, to Almira Wood, a daughter of Solomon and Lydia Wood, of Sullivan township, where her parents settled in 1821. Three children have been born to this union, viz: Herbert, a resident of Delmar; Levi, who lives in Sullivan, and Harvey, who died November 18, 1877. In politics, Mr. Roblyer is a Republican, and has served as auditor and treasurer of his township. Both he and wife are members of East Sullivan Grange". (1897 Tioga County History).

I was born in the town of Big Flats, Shemung Co., New York on the 9th of May 1823.

Father was of French descent, Mother of English forefathers. On Fathers side they emigrated from France to where New York City is now. Before the Revolutionary War they built and operated a tide grist mill across the saltmars (?)

My Mothers father, Hesekeial Howard settled in Connecticut. He served in the American army as a captain during the war and drew a pension of \$192.00 up to his death in 1832.

Sickness

On or about June 1840, at Shedric Thompsons, in the town of Rutland, Tioga Co. Penn. I was taken with a fever quite severe. Mrs. Thompson gave me a swet and the good woman did all she could for me. Was in much pain and a good share of the time out of my mind and for all the kind folks could do for me was getting worse. My friends in the town of Suliven hearing of my condition came after me and my cousin Sanford (?) succeeded in a couple of weeks in braking the fever. I never can forget to my dying day the kindness to a poor homeless boy. They would not take any pay but to say it was sufficient pay to see me well again. Again in the summer of 1845 I was taken again in harvest time with similar fever. Broke it and worked with great difficult until I had got my fall wheat sown. Was working then with Mr. Willson where I lay for five weeks most of the time out of my head. Suffered much but was well cared for by the Willsons, their neighbors the Symons, the Holcombs and the Nortons. No one would take pay except Dr. Walis and he was very reasonable. They saved the life of a poor boy for some reason, I know not why. Again in the fall of 1846 while clerking for John Davis in the city of Battlecreek, Mich., I was again taken with the fever in night-was wild. Mrs. Davis heard me when they came up stars as was walking the floor—thought I was fastened in fathers barn and was trying to get out. They called the Dr.—he said I would have a run of fever and the Davis with the help of Mr. and Mrs. Blodg cared for me a few days until Henry Benet of the Pine River Hot House came with team and took me home where I lay at the Pine River House for 5-6 weeks. Mr. and Mrs. Benet, his sister—a widowed lady, Mrs. Wildes, his brotherinlaw Mr. Hanson and his wife and other kind friends cared from me and again a poor homeless boy was saved from death for some cause I do not know.

At this time Noah Cumstalk was teaching, he quit for some cause and I went in to finish the schools 2 months. I did not and could not do justice to my school. Was 3 weeks on the lake going home got to Buffalo, was sick again, and had to go in the Mariners hospital for 4 weeks. Cost me \$12.00.

My father served in the war of 1812 for about 14 months. The he hired for \$100.00 Calvin Hockings as a substitute.

My father and Mother were both devout Christians. Belonged to the Baptist Church. I had 9 brothers and 3 sisters. They are a dead now but one brother who lives near Elmira New York and two sisters Harriet and Mary who live in the town of Big Flats New York.

My father owned a farm of 190 acres—quite good land. He was a strong man and brought up his children to work and go to and go to church. I never heard from either blaspheme or utter a slang word in my life. Mother had to work hard to provide for so large a family. I never heard her complain nor saw her angry look or head an angry work from her in my life.

From 5 years old to 8 I went to district school during the summer—after that I was old enough to work on the farm. But attended school winters and by working on my lessons evenings and carrying my Kirhams Grammar and an old Dayballs Arithmetic in my pockets and seated on the plowbeam looking over a few examples while by team rested I had become what they called quite a good scholar at 17.

Then with the consent of my father and mothers blessing I went to the town of Rutland –Tioga Co. Penn. And hired out to teach school for 4 months for \$12.00 per month and board. On the 2 day of Dec. 1840 I commenced my school. It was quite large many of my scholars much older than me. Having before learned to govern myself with hard work I got through quite to my own satisfaction and I think to the satisfaction of my employers. The next spring I was appointed by the Selectmen of the town, Inspector of schools. After my school was out I hired to Shard Thompson to work on his far for six months for \$12.00 and board. The next fall I hired to teach the village school at Roseville –Tioga Co.—Penn. The next spring after school closed went home and together with brother George worked my fathers farm.

The next winter 1843 I taught district school in the town of Corning –for \$12 and board. The next summer I worked for father and the winter of 1846 taught school in Catlin in the spring 1844 went to Michigan help my brother William on his farm during the summer and winter of 1845 taught the district school in the town of Athens, Calhoun Co., Mich. For \$245.00 per month. Worked for Jim Blackman during the summer clerking in his store. Winter of 1846 taught the school again in the town of Athens. During my two years in Michigan served as the Supt. Of Schools for the town of Athens.

In the spring of 1846 returned home to stat of N.Y. and hired out to John Hughson and Samuel Woolcut to help raft and run large ship timber and run it to New York or Tidwater for \$20.00 a month after rafting it in cribs up the Chemung River and running it to the head of the Chemung canal. I was put in charge of 35 men, 20 hosses and 5 women cooks in shanties on crib of timber. In 2 moths got timber and down to head of Cinica Lake. There we joined with other sections of Job then putting it on one large raft covering about 4-5 acres. Sent the horses around the lake to Geneva and started our sale (SAILO) for the foot of the lake and in about 2 weeks landed at the foot –44 miles. Then we took the large raft apart and tited it to 6 cribs

together by horses down Cinica Riber and Canal to Albany and then all was put together in one large raft and run down the Hudson to New York. Returned home again in November.

Winter of 1847 taught school in town of Big Flats. Summer of 1848 hired out to the Rexford Co. of Penn. To run a large raft of timber from Corning to New York City. Had 30 to 45 men no women but male cooks and we undertook to sale the lakes, with mast and sale on each corner of large raft was running like a horse race before the wind which was very rough. With James Schofield handling the left sale and I the right hand sale and within about 3 miles of the foot of the lake the left mast broke under the grate straight and down came the sale. When we could no longer guide the grate mass and it came around sideways in the grate though and in a few minutes went all to pieces and just at dusk we drifted in Singelsticks and to cover without losing a man or a stick of timber –then we had to raft all over and snow was falling before we reached New York.

Winter of 1849 taught school on Bank Canal in Lowes District. In the spring of 1849 I had gone to Wisconsin and built a house for the late Henry Delaney. Returned in the fall after buying 40 acres of land in the town of Wyocona. In the winter of 1850 taught school in town of Big Flats for \$30.00 per month and in the spring of 1850 commenced working building Breeds Steam Saw Mill. Finished in fall of 1850 then engaged to help run it. Stade there until fall of 1854 working in the mill but most of the time measuring lumber on the bank of the canal at Bennets landing. Pinevalley and other places. Most of the time by brother George was with me. Those were the happiest four years I ever spent in my life. In the winter of 1854 and 1855 taught school in the Telman Senet district for \$30.00.

In the spring of 1855 I was married to Deborah Rowley daughter of Judah Rowley of Big Flats N.Y. and in June 1855 moved to Wisconsin. Worked at housebuilding with Charles Edminister in the winter of 1855 and 56 went to housekeeping in a rented house and taught school in the town of Lowville –Columiba Co. – Wis. In the spring of 1856 built my house on my own on farm in town of Wyocena and moved in June. Worked at carpenter work for Peter Krke and in winter taught school in Dist 5 town of Wyocena. In the spring of 1856 was elected Supt. Of Schools and held the office for 2 years until office was abolished.

In the spring of 1857 was elected Justice of the Peace and also Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, town of Wyocena. Spent summer of 1857 at office work and collecting for firms in Milwaukee. In the fall of 1857 was elected to office of Supt. Of Poor for Columbia Co., Wis. And was re-elected each time for 29 years when I resigned. Was elected unanimously at each election.

I was elected to the Wisconsin Assembly by an overwhelming majority receiving every vote but 2 in my home town."

"H.W. ROBLIER, an old and esteemed resident of Coloma, died at his home last Wednesday morning after an illness extending over a period of three months.

Deceased was born in Big Flats, Chemung County, N.Y., May 7, 1823, and came to Wisconsin in 1852. He acted in the capacity of chairman of the town of Wyocena, three years, and was also superintendent of the poor of Columbia Co., for thirty years. MR. ROBLIER represented the 3d Assembly District of Columbia County, in the legislature of 1873-4. He came to Coloma in 1884, and since that time has been engaged in the grain, produce, hardware and grocery business. Before coming to this county, and in his earlier day,

MR. ROBlier filled the office of Supt. of Schools in New York, Penn., Michigan and Wisconsin....Deceased was 74 years of age, and leaves a wife and two sons." (findagrave.com).

She died Sept. 9, 1907 age 75 years and is buried in Coloma beside her husband, Hiram. They had one son William (my father) and one adopted son George Carpenter. He went on to live in Minnesota, Buffalo. He had 3 children, Zella, Keith and Clare. Keith lives in Montana and the two girls still live in Buffalo, (1971) I correspond with them. In early life Mrs. Roblier united with the Presbyterian church at Big Flats New York."

Roblyer, 70, who was head of the chemistry department at the College of Idaho for 43 years, will be conducted at 2 p.m. Monday at Jewett Auditorium on the campus.

Dr. Roblyer, who lived at 1501 E. Ash., died Thursday at a Caldwell hospital. In addition to his service as head of the college's chemistry department, which began in 1923 when he came to Caldwell, Dr. Roblyer served for two years on a part-time basis.

He also served as chief chemist and factory representative for the Nyssa-Nampa Sugar Beet Growers Association for the past 29 years, and served as a research chemist for many years for the Idaho Power Co. development program, doing a wide variety of research on area products.

Many of his former students have achieved regional and national renown for their scientific careers. Among former students was Robert E. Smylie of Boise, former governor of Idaho.

Dr. Roblyer was born July 28, 1899, in Wellsboro, Pa., where he was reared and attended elementary school. He was graduated from Muhlenberg College at Allentown, Pa., in 1920 with a major in chemistry and biology. He was granted a fellowship to study at New York University, where he earned a master of science degree.

He married Mae E. Thornton on Dec. 28, 1920 in Wellsboro, then they lived in New York City and at Danville, Ind., for two years while he taught chemistry at Danville College.

He retired from classroom teaching in 1966.

He married Laura Cavin on June 18, 1951 in Caldwell.

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The Trail has chosen to honor Dr. John Homer Roblyer with the dedication of the 1966 Trail. Dr. Roblyer is a graduate of Muhlenberg College. He received a master's degree from New York University and in 1953 was honored with a doctorate from the College of the Pacific thereby formally recognizing his stature as a chemist in the Northwest.

When Dr. Roblyer arrived, he took over the chemistry department which was then housed in the basement of Voorhees where it remained for eighteen years until Covell was constructed. Dr. Roblyer has been a member of the C of I faculty for forty-three years and will continue as a part-time laboratory associate in chemistry next year. He is the last teaching member of the "second generation" of C of I pioneers.

Dr. Roblyer has served as chief chemist for Nyssa-Nampa Sugar Beet Growers Association and has also been research chemist for the Idaho Power Development program. He has worked on projects concerned with the utilization of sagebrush oil, waste forest products, potato pulp, and the utilization of local pozzolan deposits as a concrete additive. Dr. Roblyer is credited with development of the process for obtaining pure starch from cull beans.

In announcing Dr. Roblyer's retirement, Dr. Ralph Sayre stated, "Dr. Roblyer is one of the most distinguished persons ever to have served on The College of Idaho faculty.... TRIO BURN TO DEATH NEAR CITY

Two Wichita Women and One Belle Plain Youth Die in Flaming Car

CRASH INTO OIL TRUCK

One Member of Party Escapes Death After Smash-up on South Lawrence

Three persons were killed instantly and one was injured at 4:30 a.m. Sunday when the sedan in which they were riding struck a parked oil field truck at a point nine miles south on Lawrence with terrific force, causing the gasoline tank to explode and convert the interior of the car into a seething mass of flames.

The dead:

Ernest Barner, 30, Belle Plaine.

Mrs. Fleeta Roblyer, 39, 240 North Emporia.

Ethel Davis, 35, 240 North Emporia

The injured:

J.S. White, 27, Belle Plaine farmer

White, the injured man, was cut and bruised but fought his way from the blazing car by kicking out the rear window in the sedan. He gave details of the tragedy to Deputy Sheriffs Jim Cox and Albert Bertrand.

## Met Women at Dance

Barner and White had come to Wichita Saturday night, according to the officers. They went to a dance hall at 210 South Topeka and met the women there for the first time. After the dance they entered Barner's car.

With Barner driving, the party went to Wellington and returned by way of Belle Plaine, where they stopped to get something to eat. They then started back to Wichita and had reached a point nine miles south of the city when the tragedy occurred.

According to White he was seated in the rear seat with Mrs. Roblyer who was sleepy and was leaning against him. Mrs. Davis had her arm around Barner.

The heavy truck was parked facing Wichita, with two wheels on the pavement. One tire was flat and the driver had left it to go for repairs. A light showed in the cab although there was no tail light, officers say.

White said he saw the truck but judged that it was some distance away when the crash occurred. The car was proceeding at a good rate of speed and it is not thought Barner saw the truck.

## Rod Punctures Tank

A long iron rod extending out over the rear end of the parked truck smashed through the front of the Model A Ford sedan to puncture the gasoline tank and cause the explosion.

White was hurled forward in the car. Frantically he tried to open the doors without success. He broke the glass in a rear door and plunged to safety with flames leaping so close to him that his hair was singed. White tried to rescue his friends but failed, due to the terrific heat.

As a motorist drove by White shouted for him to call an ambulance. Another call sent the booster pump of Central fire station hurrying to the scene.

It was a terrible sight that greeted officials when they arrived at the scene of the crash. The bodies, with the exception of that of Barner, were burned beyond recognition. Lieutenant Knox of the fire department lifted the bodies out of the burned machine and placed them in a Gill ambulance. Barner's body was jammed under the steering wheel.

## Hood Hurlled 100 Feet

Inspection by officers showed that the right front wheel of the sedan had struck the truck between the double tires on the left rear wheel. The force was so great that the rim of the Ford was bent inward. The radiator was bent backward and when the gasoline tank exploded it tore out most of the front part of the machine. The hood was hurled 100 feet from the wreckage. Part of the top was found dozens of feet from the scene of the crash.
